Notes on the forecast

The forecast takes into account seasonal variations in BMW and is profiled for each individual authority based on 2010/11 data. The estimate is calculated using the proportion of BMW the authority landfilled at the same period last year of its year total. This proportion is then multiplied by the actual amount of BMW landfilled in the current year to date to give a forecast of the annual amount likely to be landfilled.

We are only able to provide a forecast for those authorities that have provided accurate, timely and validated data. If there is no estimate for an indivdual authority this is because validated data was not available when the forecast was being compiled.

At Quarter 2, the forecasts for unitary authorities are likely to be accurate to within +/-15% of the stated figure. For two tier waste disposal authorities, the forecasts are likely to be accurate to within +/-10% of the stated figure. It is important to note that this is a guide only to the likely accuracy of the forecasts, based on statistical analyses limited to the previous two years' forecasts. A small number of authorities tend to fall outside these guide levels.

Currently held allowances are the original allocation adjusted to take into account trading. The figure shown corresponds to the "permitted landfill" amount on the LATS public register at 29th February 2012. Currently held allowances will change if there is further trading.
