

## What is the data from WasteDataFlow used for?

This fact sheet is intended to provide a brief overview of how the data Local Authorities submit via WasteDataFlow is used:

- To enable LAs to **run reports** for various key waste statistics to **inform LA planning and waste management**. The reports also enable LAs to **benchmark their performance** against other waste authorities, and enables LAs to **monitor their progress** over time.
- To produce **National Statistics** on municipal waste arisings.
  - **England:** *Defra Waste Statistics*
  - **Wales:** *Welsh Government*
  - **Northern Ireland:** *Department of Environment*
  - **Scotland:** *Environmental Protection Agency*
- To provide data on household waste for the **EU Waste Statistics Regulation data Return**, and from April 2011 provide data on waste from households for the **Waste Framework Directive**.
- To provide an **evidence base** to guide government, policy for example the Government Review of Waste Policy in England 2011, The Waste (Scotland) Regulations, Wales Strategy 2009 – 2050: Towards Zero Waste, The Northern Ireland Waste Management Strategy 2006 - 2020.
- Waste data is provided to number of public bodies and has **replaced a number of separate waste data surveys**, for example those carried out by:
  - Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy (CIPFA)
  - WRAP (Waste & Resources Action Programme) use the data to update their Local Authority **Waste and Recycling Information Portal**.
  - Welsh Local Government Association
  - Zero Waste Scotland
- To provide a **public resource** for waste data.
- Data is also used to answer **Parliamentary Questions**, **public enquires** and provided to organisations and research institutions for **research projects** on waste and recycling. As well as providing accurate information to support **private sector investment** decisions.
