

What is the data from WasteDataFlow used for?

This fact sheet is intended to provide a brief overview of how the data Local Authorities (LAs) submit via WasteDataFlow is used:

- To enable LAs to **run reports** for various key waste statistics **to inform LA planning and waste management**. The reports also enable LAs to **benchmark their performance** against other waste authorities and to **monitor their progress** over time.
- To produce **National Statistics** on municipal waste arisings.
 - **England:** *Defra Waste Statistics*
 - **Wales:** *Welsh Government*
 - **Northern Ireland:** *Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs*
 - **Scotland:** *Scottish Environment Protection Agency*
- To provide data on waste from households¹ for the **Waste Framework Directive**.
- To provide an **evidence base** to guide government, policy for example the Resources and Waste Strategy 2018, the Waste Management Plan for England 2021, The Environmental Improvement Plan 2023, The Waste (Scotland) Regulations, Towards Zero Waste: One Wales One Planet 2010, The Northern Ireland Waste Management Strategy 2013 - 2020.
- Waste data is provided to number of public bodies and WasteDataFlow was designed to **replace various separate waste data surveys**, for example those carried out by:
 - Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy (CIPFA)
 - Welsh Local Government Association
 - Zero Waste Scotland
- WRAP (Waste & Resources Action Programme) use the data to update their Local Authority Waste and Recycling Information Portal.
- To provide a **public resource** for waste data.
- Data is also used to answer **Parliamentary Questions**, **public enquires** and provided to organisations and research institutions for **research projects** on waste and recycling as well as providing accurate information to support **private sector investment** decisions.

¹ The "Waste from households" metric was introduced in April 2011 to provide a harmonised UK indicator with a comparable calculation in each of the four UK countries. It replaced "Household waste", which was the metric used for reporting in **EU Waste Statistics Regulation data Returns**.
